Prehabilitation checklist for patients with prostate cancer starting androgen deprivation therapy (ADT)

For men with advanced prostate cancer androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) is commonly the initial treatment, however, it can be associated with a number of physical and mental adverse effects. A discussion with the patient about such potential effects is important prior to initiating treatment ie. prehabilitation. A short checklist, as provided here as a print-out or for online completion, can help facilitate such discussions and noted in the patient's records, supporting follow-up.
